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ADULT ODONATA OF THE CATHERWOOD PERUVIAN-AMAZON
EXPEDITION

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ABSTRACT.—A report on 27 species of Odonata collected near Tingo Maria and Iquitos, Peru. Four Agrionidae, eight Coenagrionidae, three Aeshnidae, twelve Libellulidae. Two new species are described: *Argia mariensis* (♂) from Tingo Maria, *Aeolagrion inalatum* (♀) from Iquitos.

The following species of adult Odonata were collected during the course of the Catherwood Peruvian-Amazon Expedition of 1955. Unless otherwise noted, they were collected by Dr. Selwyn S. Roback.

With the exception of the two localities near Iquitos, Peru, all the other localities were in the vicinity of Tingo Maria, Peru. The latter area is at an altitude of about 2,500 feet. The Quebrada de Puente Perez is a small tributary of the Huallaga and crosses the Tingo Maria to Lima Road about 5 miles southwest of Tingo Maria. The Rio Rondos, Rio Bella, and Limestone Creek are all tributaries of the Monzon on the Sindicata Monzon, and enter that river within a few miles of its junction with the Huallaga. Puerto Nuevo on the Tulumayo is about 10 miles northeast of Tingo Maria.

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
